(Strengths)

- *Provides a Main Entrance that is Safe, Obvious, & Intuitive for day & night
- *Secures elementary school and district office entrances
- *Improves safety and traffic flow for parent pick-up and drop off areas
- *Addresses accessibility concerns to our school, especially for senior citizens and grandparents who want to attend school and community events
- *Addresses Career & Tech Ed auto shop and construction trades space needs by repurposing 1926 gym that doesn't function well for current demands. Value added benefit is keeping CTE program on campus vs. student traveling to another site.
- *Addresses gym space needs for Elem, youth, community& senior programs
- *Total HVAC update will add energy efficiency, eliminate outdated controls, steam, and need for hard to find parts. Classroom noise issue addressed.
- *Maintain a single K-12 School that is more parent & community accessible with greater operational efficiencies.
- *Addresses undersized cafeteria & early lunch times(K is@10:45 am)
