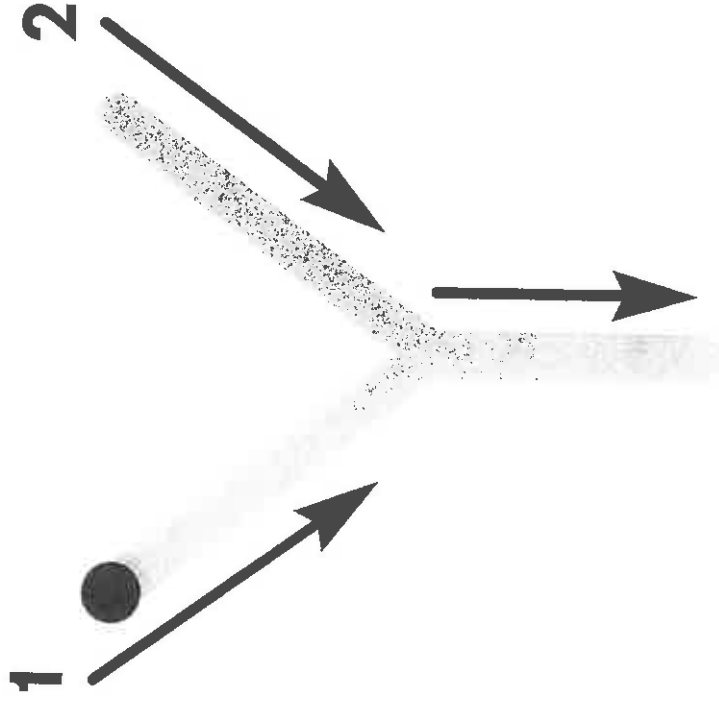


Yellow Dough

Y is for yellow.



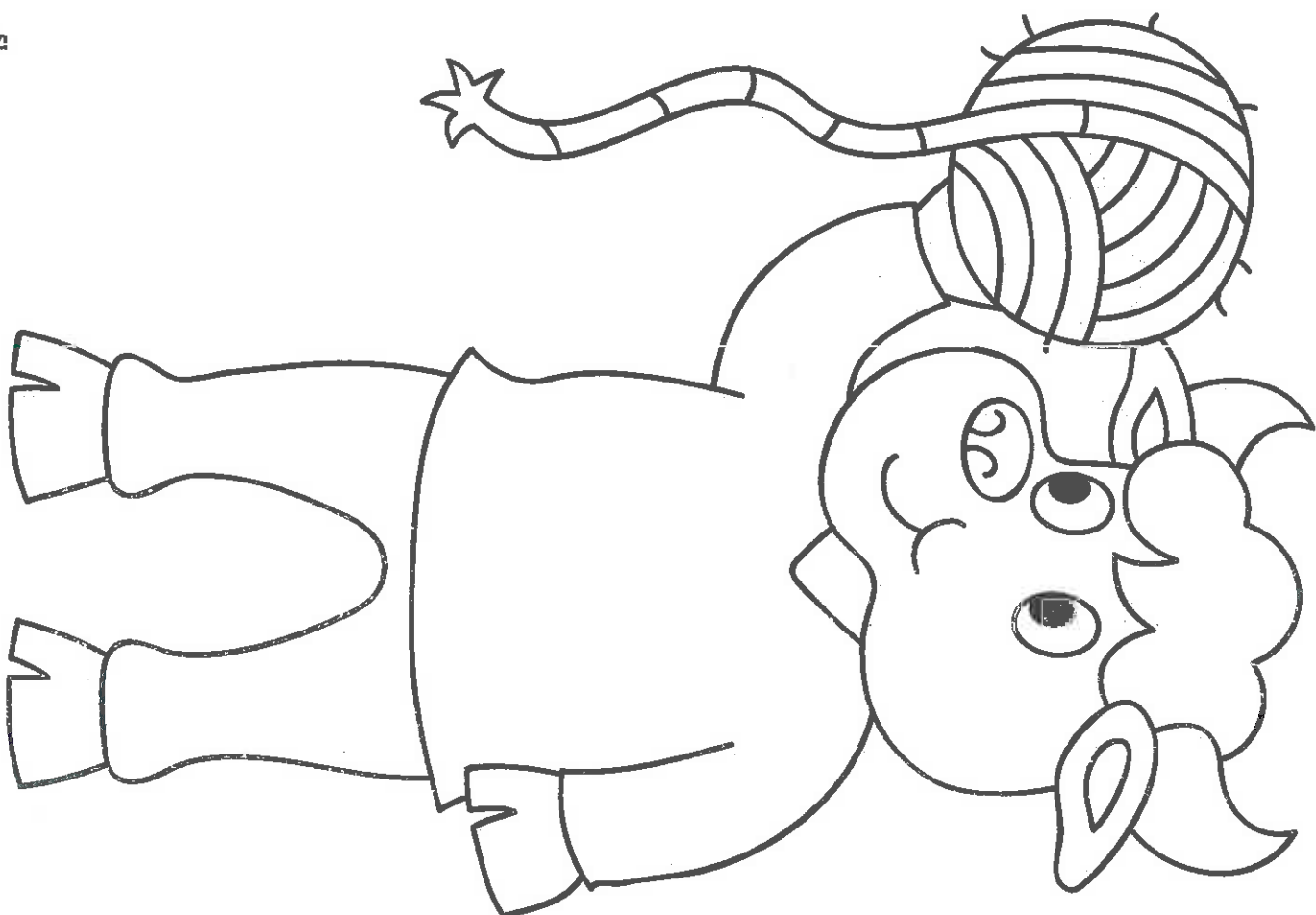
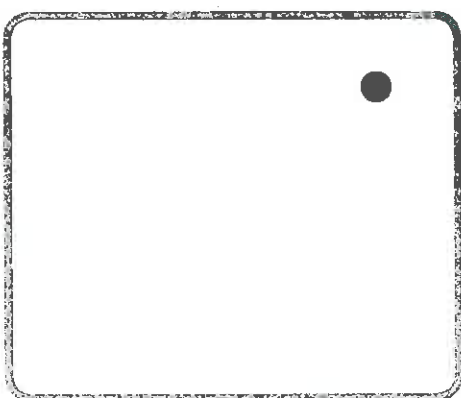
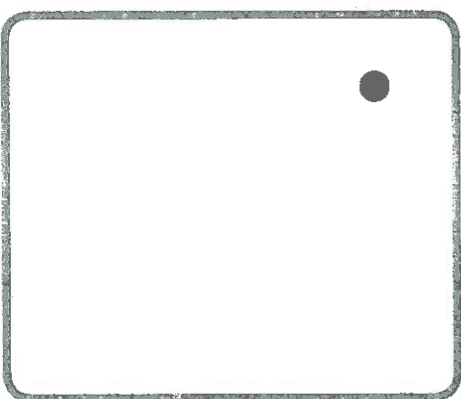
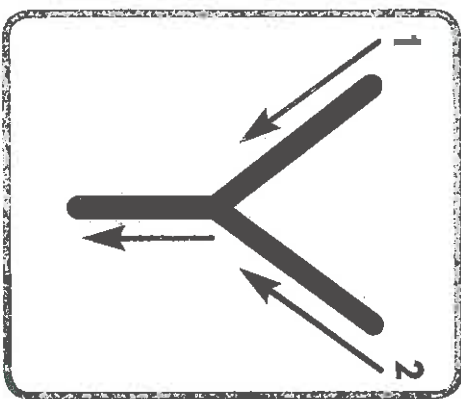

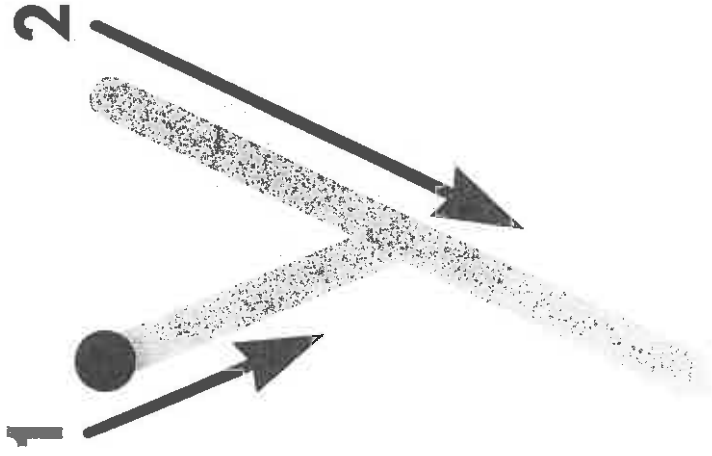


Directions: Ask children to trace and write uppercase **Y** in the boxes above. Encourage them to color the yak and the yarn as they name each one aloud.

Y is for young.



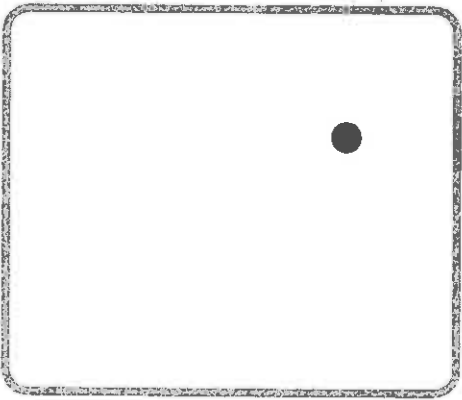
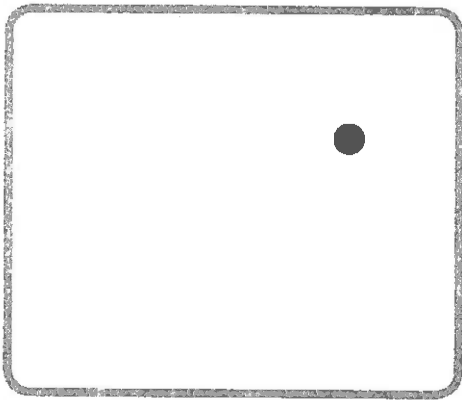
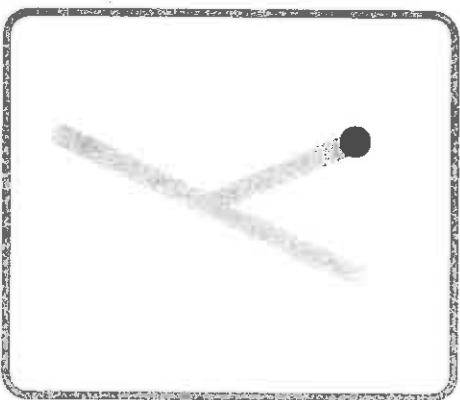
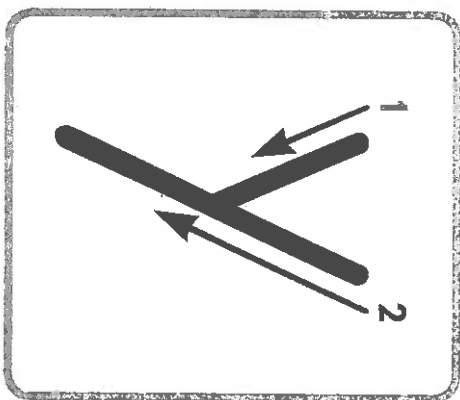
