
The number of participants registered and paid for by the May 7th deadline will determine if the activity will be held or cut! (If your activity is cut, you will be notified and you will receive your payment back.)



Instructor. Group lessons for students currently in grades K-6 will be offered at the Springfield Golf Club this summer on the following dates: May 22 and 22. following dates: May 23 and 30, June 6, 13, and 20. Students finishing kindergarten will have an abbreviated session from 8:15-8:45 a.m., while the students in grades 1-3 will meet from 9:00-10:00 a.m., and grades 4-6 from 10:15-11:15 a.m. Students will learn everything from short game to full shots as well as the rules and etiquette of golf. Summer Speech Team Jumpstart-

Students entering grades 7-12 during the next school year. \$25 for 3 summer sessions and 1 bonus session during speech season; sessions are private lessons lasting at least 30 minutes

(Students should sign up through Community Education, pay fee, and will be contacted by the instructor for a meeting at Springfield Public Library at a mutually convenient time.)

New students will explore category choices and will be given help in selecting a category appropriate to student's interests and skill set. Current team members can use the opportunity to get a head start in preparing for the 2019 speech season. On an individual basis, public speaking students (oratory, informative, great speeches, extemp speaking) will receive guidance in choosing a topic, finding quality research, creating a rough outline, and beginning the written text of the speech. Interp students (poetry, prose, drama, humorous, duo, program oral interp) will be directed to literature to select and provided guidance in cutting a larger story into a smaller performance piece. Jumpstart students will have the opportunity to receive feedback (electronically) on speech script or introductions throughout the speech season. This is a perfect opportunity for students who wish to double-enter or work on a program oral interp for the National Speech and Debate Association contest to get prepared ahead of time.
