Summer Rec. Activities

Grade level listed is the grade child is currently in as of May 2021.

Exploring Science – Tuesday–Friday, June 1-4, 9-9:45 am each day.

For those currently in grades K-2. Mrs. Amsden, Instructor. Mrs. Amsden's room. Students will learn more about the scientific process and conduct simple science experiments. Registration fee is \$20.



Woodworking – Build a Bird House! – Tuesday, June 22, 10-11:30 am. For those currently in Grades 4-6. Assemble a pre-cut wood birdhouse using sandpaper, hammer/nails. You'll be able to paint/stain the birdhouse too! Shop Room. Registration fee is \$25.

"Beach" Volleyball – Mondays, 10-11am. For boys and girls who are currently in grades 4-6. Riverside Park, Sand VB Court. Students must wear tennis shoes. Enjoy an hour each week playing VB outside! Registration fee is \$10.



Flower Pot Gardens –Tuesday, June 8, 10-11 am. Join others in planting your own container flower garden. Bring your own flower pot filled with potting soil! Flowers will be provided. Open to those currently in grades K-6. School Greenhouse. Ms. Hansen, Instructor. Registration fee is \$8.



Laugh n' Learn = Wednesdays, June 2, 9, 16 & 23, 9-10 am. Ms. Amber, Instructor. Fun and learning for those eligible for Kindergarten in Fall 2021. Preschool Room. Registration fee is \$18.

Purposeful Play - Wednesdays, June 2, 9, 16 & 23, 10-11 am. Ms. Amber, Instructor. Learn through play for 3 & 4 year olds (must be potty-trained). Preschool Room. Registration fee is \$18.

Babysitting Clinic – Thursday, June 17, 9-12 pm at the SPS Elem.K-3 Flex Room. Ms. Amber, Instructor. Participants must be 11 years old or older (or within 6 months of their 11th birthday). This interactive course prepares participants for the various situations they may encounter while caring for a child. The class teaches simple care like feeding and changing to basic first aid. Students are tested on all the information presented at the clinic and will receive a certificate of participation. Registration fee is \$15.

Cool Crafts! – Tuesdays from 10-11 am for PS-1; Thursdays from 10-11 am for grades 2-6. *Cool Crafts* is for boys and girls! Each group

will meet weekly during summer rec. Enjoy making some really neat stuff for yourself or family! All supplies included. Registration fee: \$20 (PS-1); \$24 (gr. 2-6).

"Home Alone" Safety Workshop – sponsored by Springfield Police Department. **Friday, June 18, 9-10 am** at SPS Elem. Multi-Cultural Room. An important workshop for those who are currently in 4th-6th grade. An Officer will teach essential information if you are home alone this summer. Do you answer the phone? What do you say; do you answer the door? Who to go to for help; important phone numbers; what are your families rules?; etc. Children will bring information home to help families make their own individual "home alone" plan. FREE class.



Bike Safety – sponsored by Springfield Police Department. **Friday, June 18, 10-11 am** in SPS parking lot by Cafeteria. Register for this **FREE** class. Open to children currently in PS – 6th grade.

Games Galore! - Thursdays, 9-10 am. Depending on numbers, students will be split into two groups by age: PS (entering Kindergarten this fall) – grade 2 and grades 3-6 will join friends for a morning of playing fun games! Games will be played inside and outside and will include large muscle activities and board games. Registration fee is \$10.

Tennis –Tuesdays and Thursdays, 10-11 am @ Riverside Tennis Courts. For boys and girls who are currently in 3-6th grade. Learn the basics of the game and enjoy playing tennis with others! Bring your own racket, if available. Registration fee is \$24.



Cooking with Kids – Tuesday, June 15 from 10- 12 pm AND Tuesday, June 22 from 11–1pm. Sign up for both classes or only one! For those in grades 3-6. Enjoy cooking and eating with friends! Ms. Block, Instructor. FCS Room. Registration fee is \$10/class.



Junior Golf Clinic–Wednesdays, 8:15-11:15 am – Mr. Kuehn, Instructor. Group lessons for students currently in grades K-6 will be offered at the Springfield Golf Club this summer on the following dates: June 2, 9, 16, 23 & 30. Students finishing kindergarten will have an abbreviated session from 8:15-8:45 a.m., while the students in grades 1-3 will meet from 9:00-10:00 a.m., and grades 4-6 from 10:15-11:15 a.m. Students will learn everything from short game to full shots as well as the rules and etiquette of golf. Students should bring their own clubs if available. If not, additional sets will be made available for practice and play. The clinic will include a series of 5 lessons on the putting green, range, and golf course. Class size is limited. Registration fees are \$25 (kindergarten) and \$50 (grades 1-6). These fees includes range balls, green fees, and a meal on the final day. Depending on registration, this group may continue throughout the summer as a Jr. Golf League.

Speech Team Jumpstart for Public Speaking Categories (Original Oratory, Extemp Speaking, Great Speeches) and Program Oral Interp

Students entering grades 7-12 during the next school year. \$28 for 3 summer sessions and 1 bonus session during speech season; sessions are private lessons lasting at least 30 minutes. United Way of Brown County scholarships are available. Cheryl Neidt, Instructor.

(Students should sign up through Community Education, pay fee, and will be contacted by the instructor for a meeting at Springfield Public Library at a mutually convenient time during the summer.)

Public speaking categories uniquely help students to be critical thinkers and consumers of news surrounding current events and important issues of our time. New students will explore the category choices and will be given help in selecting a category appropriate to student's interests and skill set. Current team members can use the opportunity to get a head start in preparing for the 2022 speech season which may include a double entry in a public speaking event or program oral interp. On an individual basis, students (oratory, great speeches, extemp speaking) will receive guidance in choosing a topic, finding quality research, creating a rough outline, and beginning the written text of the speech. Program oral interp students will be assisted in creating a theme, directed to literature to select, and provided guidance in cutting larger portions of various literature into a performance piece. Jumpstart students will have the opportunity to receive unlimited feedback (electronically) on speech script or introductions throughout the speech season. This is a perfect opportunity for students who wish to double-enter or work on a program oral interp for the National Speech and Debate Association contest.
